

March is Reading Month!

A new study found that young children whose parents read to them five books a day enter kindergarten having heard about 1.4 MILLION more words than kids who were never read to. That's a lot of words and all before kindergarten.

Reading to children at an early age promotes growth in all these areas:

Speech
Listening and Comprehension
Phonological Awareness
Alphabetic knowledge
Reading
Book enjoyment & knowledge
Writing

All in all I think we can all agree, READING IS IMPORTANT! Whether you are reading a Facebook post, or in the middle of a novel, or simply driving to work, or you are reading.

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Reading is how you learn about the world, explore through imagination, and develop your mind. The same goes for the young ones. Infant, toddler, 'threenager' you name it, they all grow each and every time you read a book to them!

So what does that look like? What can I do at home? What is my child gaining from this experience? Check out these tips and tricks...

Infants:

- It always grabs a babies attention when you are animated and smiling! Start there!
- Hold them and let them know that reading time is a time they are held and loved.
- · Name animals and make the sounds they make.
- Let them lift the flaps and see what is hiding underneath.
- Name a picture that they are pointing at, this gives the word's meaning.
- · Repeat books that they like or show interest in.

Toddlers:

- Create a reading routine! This could be at bed time,
 after dinner, or even in the morning.
- Choose books that help teach them social concepts.
 (ex. 'No Biting' 'Everyone Poops')
- $\bullet\,$ Sing the alphabet song and point to letters.
- Point out numbers and colors.
- Let them turn the page (even if it is backwards). Allow them to choose the book, this shows repeated interest and promotes their love for books.

3 & Up:

- Try out books that reflect your daily routine or situations at home. (ex. Llama Llama Misses Mama
-)Take a walk around your local library and see what they choose, follow their interest.
- Emphasize rhyming words and words that begin with the same sound.
- Point out who the book was written by and who drew the pictures.
 (Author & Illustrator)
- Ask questions, let your child make predictions about what's going to happen next or what is happening on that page.
- · Point and read, this teaches children that you read from left to right

Chicken Veggie Skillet

Ingredients:

3 1/2 cups cooked chicken meat

1/2 cup orzo past

2 tablespoons olive or vegetable oil

dried onion

Carrots

2 cups chicken stock

1/2 teaspoon kosher salt

1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

1 cup frozen peas

1/2 cup heavy cream

1/2 cup freshly grated parmesan cheese

Directions:

- Pick the meat from the cooked chicken and roughly cut up and set aside.
- In a large dry skillet pan over medium high cook orzo until lightly browned; about 3 minutes stirring frequently
- Remove browned orzo to a bowl and add oil to hot pan $\,$
- · Add carrots and onion sauté for 4 minutes
- Add orzo back in along with stock, garlic powder, salt & pepper. Cover and reduce heat to a medium simmer and simmer cook the orzo, about 8-10 minutes
- Uncover and add parsley, peas and cream along with cooked chicken.
- Increase heat and cook just to bring the dish to temperature and incorporate the ingredients.
- · Serve with grated parmesan over the top

Active Learning in Our Classrooms

Here at The Learning Tree you will see active learning in all of our classrooms; infants - school age. Our teachers and classroom are set up with materials to help guide children to explore, interact and exercise their creative imagination through purposeful play.

Active learning is also supported in four different areas that highscope curriculum supports:

• Adult-Child Interaction

Some key strategies for adult-child interactions are touching, holding, play alongside at their level and pace, communicating in give-and-take exchanges verbally and nonverbally, respecting children's choices and encouraging their efforts, acknowledging children's strong emotions, and involving toddlers in resolving conflicts.

• Learning Environment

The classroom is organized into play and care areas that serve the needs for the age group of children where they can reach the appropriate materials needed to explore and play with their own way at their own pace.

· Schedules & Routines

A consistent yet flexible daily routine that supports the child's age. These daily routines will give children a sense of security and stability which will create trust between the child and teacher, and also builds independence as children engage with their environment and the people around them.

Observation

Object observations of children allow teachers to plan and build lesson plans to support the children's learning.

Overall, highscope curriculum and active learning allows children to grow and learn at their own pace and gain a great sense of independence.

This past month we celebrated Valentine's Day in our classrooms. We had an absolute blast and wanted to share some of the pictures with you.












